FAQ: Athletes Foot

How do I Prevent Athletes Foot?

Keep feet dry, especially between the toes. Change socks regularly (daily), sweaty feet may require you to change socks twice daily. Wear sandals or waterproof shoes in public places. If you are at risk, use anti-fungal powder or spray daily. Wear well ventilated shoes. Change shoes if exposed to moisture (allows them to dry out
